When are the tests?

- Monday 9th May – English grammar & spelling: papers 1 & 2
- Tuesday 10th May – English reading
- Wednesday 11th May – Maths paper 1 (arithmetic) and 2 (reasoning)
- Thursday 12th May – Maths paper 3 (reasoning)



What support is available during the test?

- In the reading test, children must read the text and questions by themselves
- In maths and GPAS, teachers can read questions to any child who asks; some children will have the whole paper read to them, on a one to one basis. These children will be identified through specific tests that we will carry out in the next couple of weeks.
- Teachers can encourage, but not guide or say that an answer is correct or incorrect.
- Words on a test paper can be transcribed where a marker may not be able to read a child's answer.



How we help your child at school

- Revision of key learning – books have been given out to support this at home too, please ensure that they bring them to school each day.
- Practising past papers – technique!
- Breakfast booster club from 8.15am Monday to Thursday from after Easter
- SATs breakfast 8.15am from 9th May
- Drop in sessions





How can you support your child at home?

The best help is interest taken in learning and progress.

Attending meetings and parents evenings.

Supporting home learning.

Not putting children under too much pressure.

Ensure that your child reads regularly

Ensuring children arrive for tests:

- in good time
- having had breakfast
- having gone to bed at a reasonable time





Sickness

If your child is poorly during the week of SATs, we suggest that where possible, they attend for the SAT test, then go home and rest – should this happen please call us as early as possible and we will advise as to what to do.

If your child is suffering serious illness, then alternative arrangements can be made, with the school, for SATs tests to be completed at home under supervision.
