

# Sports Premium Funding 2017-2018

## Brooke Hill Academy



### BACKGROUND

The Government is providing additional in order to improve the provision of physical education and sport in primary schools. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to schools to be spent on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

All state-maintained schools, academies, middle schools, special schools and pupil referral units which have primary aged pupils (as reported in the 2013 school census) will receive the funding. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision for PE and sport in schools. We will be held accountable for how we have used the additional funding to support pupils progress and participation in PE and school sport. We are required to publish on-line information about how we have used the additional funding, including details about our sporting provision alongside curriculum details.

This will ensure that parents/carers and others are made fully aware of the PE and sporting provision at our school.

This year the funding provided stands at £16,000 for Brooke Hill.

### OUR VISION

All pupils leaving primary school physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.

## **OUR OBJECTIVE**

To achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools.

We would expect indicators of such improvement to include:

- the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
- high profile of PE and sport the school as a tool for whole school improvement
- increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- increased participation in competitive sport

Sports Apprentice	£2500		Training & employment of a sports apprentice to aid sports involvement across the MAT and assist with competition and festival work across the schools.
Rugby coaching Terms 3&4	£1000		<p>Programme of CPD to ensure teachers feel confident delivering Tag Rugby across KS2. Focus on training the teaching staff to deliver sessions along with lesson content, as well as guidance and rules of playing Tag Rugby. Six-week programme in each key stage using demonstration, coaching and observing to ensure staff development.</p> <p>Additionally, the necessary equipment such as balls, will be purchased to ensure these sessions can run to their maximum potential and include all the children.</p>
Gymnastics Coaching Y3 45 Children	£500		Opportunity for the gym squad and children interested in the discipline, to receive specialist coaching. Focus on control, discipline, basic movements and how to utilise the body to move another person. Specialist coaching not able to be provided in school, along with the possibility of children progressing in the sport outside school.

Spotlight dance	£600		Dance festival - children will have the opportunity to perform their dance on stage over 2 nights to a full audience. Coaching will also be provided for this to help prepare the staff and children and develop performance skills, interpretation of music, rhythm and confidence. Cost also includes the £100 entrance fee and the purchase of accessories to enhance their performance.
School games participation	£3000 Tag rugby, sportshall athletics, basketball development, hockey, etc see calendar for school games events		Travel costs - almost all school games events involve travelling by minibus or coach. Each time the cost varies between £85 - £100. We are meeting the cost to increase the level of competition within the school and to create excitement around representing the school as part of a school team. Cover is also often required for teachers and TAs to accompany the children. We are proud of the fact that no other school in county attends more sporting events than Brooke Hill.
Equipment replenishment	£600		Sports kits to accommodate the extra children taking part in schools and extra events attended. School footballs and other play equipment to be used on the AstroTurf during playtimes. Extra

			equipment required for new clubs such as table tennis, as well as the upkeep of current equipment.
Pool maintenance	£1000		Contribution towards maintenance of pool at Edith Weston - used by our EYFS and KS1 pupils. Water heater maintenance check. Water testing monthly. General maintenance
Juggling Skills	£800		Following on from last year's successful Circus Skills Workshop, specialist workshops and equipment to encourage a different avenue to sports and activities through circus skills. The aim is to get all children active and try out new activities. Training for all staff including MDS to ensure equipment purchased can be used to its full potential during playtimes and lunchtimes.
Additional coaching	£800		Specialist coaching for school teams in preparation for school games event. Children invited to attend who are interested in being part of the school team then selection by the coach takes place based on skills, attitude, and attendance, such as table tennis.
Change for Life	£800		Support coaching for children who do not usual partake in sport, lack confidence or are considered medically obese. Programme to encourage them to

			get active in small groups with an external coach who can offer lots of different activities to meet everyone's needs. Children selected by class teacher to attend and invited to go along to the weekly session with the view that they maybe take up a school club in the future. This year we will also be offering Change for Life to children who attend our Breakfast Club.
Module 1&2 swimming teaching	£60 pp 4 People attending £240		Teachers or TAs will be able to lead swimming teaching and assessment and therefore an additional swimming teacher will not be needed.
Teachers & TAs Rutland CPD	£45 pp £900 (x 20 courses)  Level 5 Teaching PE course x1 £500		Individual CPD for class teachers and TAs run by Rutland School sport manager - range of courses offered to facilitate good-outstanding teaching of PE across the age ranges and curriculum. Teacher to attend level 5 Foundation Degree in Teaching PE with RCC, to then be fed back internally to help with the delivery of PE lessons throughout the school.
Playground games and equipment	£400		Y6 sports leaders to support children in good playground practise - how to play co-operatively, use equipment sensibly, be responsible.

			Supervision by MDS and/or TA to support this programme. Also to include the replenishment of 'huff and puff' equipment for the sports leaders to use during these sessions.
Maintenance of astro-turf/development of outside play provision	£3,000		Resurfacing of outside play provision to ensure its use during the winter months to allow outdoor PE and clubs to continue. Provision made for matched funding to develop our outdoor play provision for the benefit of all children at lunchtimes.
Inter House Sports Competitions	£500		Launch of new Inter House Competitions, to be run termly throughout the school covering various sporting activities to encourage all to access, such as cross country and dancing. Trophy to be purchased, to be awarded to the winning house after each event and ongoing competition to run throughout the year. Also, cover will be provided to release the PE Co-Ordinator to support the Sports Ambassadors/Leaders to help run and organise these events.
