### Maths Workshops

Year 3 / 4 have settled back into school fantastically after the festive break. This week we have been discovering all about the human skeleton, naming the bones, and looking at it's function. We have also started on our historical topic of 'Innovation and Industry' during the Victorian era. We have travelled through time, looking at the periods of history that took place between our last topic of the Vikings, all the way to the Victorianswhere we have looked at some of the significant dates during the period.



### **Year 5/6**

This week we have started our new topic 'The Tudors'! In English we have started our new class book 'Treason' by Berlie Doherty. In the story Will, the paige of Prince Edward has to flee Hampton Court and go into hiding in the back streets of London, hoping to free his father who has been accused of treason. This week the children have learnt about the features used in newspaper articles in preparation of composing their own newspaper article set in Tudor times.

In history the children discussed what they already knew about the Tudors and what they would like to learn during the topic. They discussed the Tudor family tree and the advantages and disadvantages of being a Tudor monarch. After learning about Henry VIII wives many of the children decided they didn't want to be a Tudor monarch after all.

The children then answered questions based on the Tudor family tree and discussed which monarch was their favourite and why.

Fun Fact: People in Tudor times didn't eat with a fork – they ate using knives, spoons and their fingers!
