




## Year 3/4














Next term the whole school topic will be based on the book 'Journey' by Aaron Becker.




On Thursday 7 March 2024

favourite story.




### The Business Enterprise Tuck Shop

# **Home School Charter**

At our school we believe that nurturing children to be the best that they can be extends beyond the classroom and we value the partnership with our parents and families in supporting their children. To provide the very best for all of the the children we hope that all of our families will be committed to upholding the expectations set out in this Home School Charter.

#### We expect that parents:

- Support your child to uphold the school rules of Ready, Safe, Respectful at all times and try their best in all that they do.
- Children read every day at home, this is the most important thing they can do and will benefit them immensely both in school and for the rest of their lives.
- Are on time each day so that children are ready to start their learning and collected on time at the
  end of the day.
- Children are supported in homework and other opportunities for home learning.
- Be respectful when speaking/emailing staff. Do not to post any concerns, criticisms or defamatory statements about the staff or school on social networking sites. Please be kind and work with us.
- Your child is properly equipped and wears the correct school uniform and PE Kit (if you are eligible for pupil premium funding we can support you with uniform costs).
- Inform the school office of the reason for any absence by 9.00am.
- Let the school know about any concerns or problems that might affect your child's work or behaviour and work with staff to seek a resolution.
- Attend parents' evenings and meetings as required about your child's progress.
- Do not take holidays in school time and attempt to take routine medical and dental appointments outside school time wherever possible.
- That children do not have piercings other than single stud earrings. Ears should not be pierced
  except in the summer holidays so as not to interfere with PE as they should not be taped over.
- Understand that any photos taken in school are for personal use only and you will not send or share
  on the internet any pictures that include any other children.

#### You can expect that we will:

- Provide an education which nurtures children as individuals to achieve their very best.
- Provide the children with a range of learning opportunities and enrichment that will support them to enjoy their learning.
- Support all children, whatever their needs, race, culture or background to achieve their full potential.
- Listen when you have a worry or concern and work with you to resolve it.
- Achieve high standards of work and behaviour through providing a rich learning environment and a challenging curriculum.
- Provide an open, welcome and safe environment at all times and offer opportunities for you to become involved in the life of the school.
- Keep you informed of school activities through our newsletter and social media links.
- Discuss with you any concerns or problems that affect your child's work and contact you if there is a
  problem with attendance, punctuality or behaviour.
- Have an 'open-door' policy and encourage you to share any concerns with us.
- Offer support and guidance to parents who require additional help.
- · Provide an annual report and two parents evenings each year.
- Provide key school information through our school and Trust website and all polices can be made available upon request.
