







## **YEAR 3 / 4**

### **SATS Booster Interventions**



A letter went out this week inviting all of our Year 6 children to the SATS Booster breakfast. Our Year 6 SATS booster breakfast sessions will start on the morning of the 13.5.24 and will run from 8.15 to 8.45 for all Year 6 children for the four days. The sessions will be held in Hazel class and breakfast will be provided to all Year 6's who attend. Previous SATS breakfast booster sessions have proven to build confidence and recall so we feel they will be extremely beneficial to all children.

For the four weeks running up to SATS Miss Jackson, Mrs Mitchell and Mr Walden will be running further optional boosters after school to support the children with their test technique and consolidate the learning that has taken place in school. The Maths Booster will run on Tuesdays from 3.30-4.30 and the Reading Booster on Thursdays from 3.30-4.30. A sign up sheet has been sent out to all of our Year 6 parents.

The tests will be administered on the following dates:

- Monday 13th May 2024 Spelling, punctuation and grammar (45 minutes).
- Monday 13th May 2024 Spellings (20 minutes approx.)
- Tuesday 14th May 2024 Reading (60 minutes)
- Wednesday 15th May 2024 Maths paper 1 Arithmetic (30 minutes)
- Wednesday 15th May 2024 Maths paper 2 Reasoning (40 minutes)
- Thursday 16th May 2024 Maths paper 3 Reasoning (40 minutes)
